## Health facility opens its doors in Beavercreek

BEAVERCREEK — The area's newest medical center was dedicated at a ribbon-cutting ceremony May 27 in Beavercreek.

The ribbon-cutting marked the grand opening of the Ollie Davis Medical Arts and Education Center, a new facility housing services from Greene Memorial Hospital and Wright State Physicians Family Medicine and Wright State University Boonshoft School of Medicine.

Located on Darst Road off of Indian Ripple Road in Beavercreek, the 21,000 squarefoot facility provides area residents imaging services, laboratory services and family practice physicians, while also serving as an education center for future family practitioners.

Local developer Ollie Davis constructed the medical center on commercial property she has owned since 1991. Davis decided to work with Greene Memorial Hospital on the project after she and hospital leaders recognized that they both shared the common goal of improving health care access and services in Beavercreek.

Medical imaging services include a 16-slice CT scanner, an ultrasound machine with the most up-to-date version of software, and a full range of orthopedic and diagnostic x-ray offerings. A full-service phlebotomy lab offers extended hours during the week. Anyone with a physician's order may use these services.

This new patient-centered practice location for Wright State Physicians Family Medicine features state-of-the art electronic health records, and 24 exam rooms, two of which are equipped with exam tables designed for geriatric patients. In addition to Family Medicine, Wright State Physicians Geriatrics is offering geriatric medicine services at the new medical facility. Their Geriatric Medicine Clinic is now accepting new patients, referrals and consults.

## Insurance agents also educate clients

BEAVERCREEK — They are more than just insurance agents. Brian Lampton, co-owner of Lampton/Engle & Associates Insurance & Financial Services, said he and John Engle often find themselves educating clients in two of their specialty policies. They sell coverage for small businesses and historic or classic cars.

It is likely that many new customers asking about small-business insurance are casualties of the economic downturn, Lampton said. Engle, owner of a classic car, helps people seeking coverage for motorcycles, boats and historic vehicles, Lampton said. At times, they have to explain a caller's vehicle does not meet the "historic" or classic standards.

Lampton and Engle stay active in the Beavercreek community. Lampton announces Beavercreek High School home football games, has coached youth sports and is active in the local club of Rotary International. As a Rotarian, he has helped provide dictionaries and books to elementary school students.

Engle helps with the car show during the Beavercreek Popcorn Festival and volunteers at Carillon Park. Citing his "knack for yak," he serves as a tour guide at Carillon, he said.
